Independence: Giving our students a place to play, create and explore without having someone showing them what to do each step of the way, gives them confidence that helps create independence.

Fine Motor Skills: Cutting, screwing, nailing, tying...each of these skills help our students learn to use their little hands to create! Being able to grasp small objects and manipulate them effectively also helps little ones develop fine motor skills.
